H.S.H. Prince Rainier III, reigning Prince of Monaco, former IOC Member from 1949 to 1950.

Mr. Frank King (CAN), Chairman of OCO'88.

OLYMPIC ORDER

Mr. Rubén Acosta (MEX), President of the International Volleyball Federation.

Mrs. Eileen Anderson (GBR), coach of the British skating team, notably of Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean, gold medallists at the Sarajevo Winter Games.

Mr. Taieb Houichi (TUN), Vice-President of the International Amateur Boxing Association, and President of the African Amateur Boxing Committee.

Mr. Ralph Klein (CAN), Mayor of Calgary.

Mr. Reiner Klimke (FRG), former equestrian champion, gold medal in 1964 in dressage, gold medal and bronze medal in individual and team dressage in 1968 and 1976.

Mr. Jerry Kuruczka (POL), one of the most famous climbers of all time. He has climbed 14 summits over 8,000 metres.

Mr. Ante Lambasa (YUG), former President of the International Amateur Swimming Federation.

Mr. Wolf Lyberg (SWE), secretary of the Swedish Olympic Committee.

Mr. Antonio G. Mariscal y Abascal (MEX), permanent member of the Mexican Olympic Committee since 1968, deputy secretary to the Panamerican Sports Organization. Former diving champion.



Mr. Berthold Beitz, Vice-President of the Executive Board and IOC Member in the Federal Republic of Germany, presented Mr. Josef Neckermann with the Olympic Order upon his return from Calgary.

Mr. Josef Neckermann (FRG), an extremely able horseman, bronze medal in dressage in Rome, 1960, gold medal in dressage in Tokyo, 1964, gold and silver in the individual and team dressage events in Mexico, silver and bronze medals in Munich, 1972. President of the German Sports Aid Foundation.

Mr. Bill Pratt (CAN), OCO'88 President.

Mr. Frederick J. Ruesegger (USA), former private secretary to Avery Brundage, the former IOC President.

Mr. Anisio Silvia Rocha (BRA), former Olympic champion and participant in the modern pentathlon, President of the Brazilian Confederation of Equestrian Sports, Member of the Brazilian Olympic Committee.

Mr. Jasdev Singh (IND), writer and journalist, television and radio sports commentator, he has made a significant contribution to the development of sport in India. He is currently head of the sports service for Indian television.

Dr. Josef Sir (HUN), member of the IAAF for 33 years, he is on the Executive and is a technical delegate.
