## Panathlon International

On the occasion of the 12th Panathlon International Congress, Ottavio Cinquanta, IOC member and president of the International Skating Union (ISU), presented the Olympic Order to Antonio Spallino, former president of Panathlon International. Antonio Spallino was several times team épée and team foil world champion, and he won the

gold medal for team foil at the Games of the XVI Olympiad in Melbourne in 1956. He was president of Panathlon International from 1988 to 1996 and is now chairman of its cultural commission. He is also a member of the board of the International Committee for Fair Play, and honorary vice-president of the International Association of Sports Law.
