

1926 Haskell figures

The 1926 Haskell powerhouse is reflected in their team statistics we have so far been able to complete. On offense (9 games of rushing stats and 8 games of passing) Haskell averaged 407.9 yards per game rushing and 32.9 yards passing, while on defense the opposition was held to an average of 31.8 yds rushing and 48.4 yds passing. Haskell played what was considered a "major" school schedule in 1926, and the top major Team Rushing figure nationally as compiled so far for 1926 by Mark Purcell, is approximately 400 yds per game by Minnesota. The four missing games of rushing stats, based on the scores, would do nothing to lower their figure significantly, so we can say that Haskell could very possibly be the national Team Rushing leader for the 1926 season.
