A St. Louis special, under date of July 19, states that catcher Jack Connor, of Little Rock, has announced his acceptance of the St. Louis Browns' management under a five-year contract with President Hedges.

Pitcher Jesse Tannehill, while enjoying the day at the Seventh Ward Fishing Club, opposite Coney Island, near Cincinnati, on July 21, fell out of a tree, dislocating his shoulder. The injury was remedied at the City Hospital.

Louis Padrone, a Cuban outfielder, has been signed by President Comiskey, of Chicago. Padrone has been playing in Cuba for several years, and before that he played with the New Britain team in the Connecticut League.

The New York Club has asked for waivers on pitcher Jack Chesbro. If no major league club claims him he will retire and devote himself to the lumber business at Conway, Mass., as he is determined not to play in any minor league.

Joe Vila says: "The Highlanders have shown so much improvement away from home that a winning streak is looked for when they come back to the hilltop next week. If they slump again on their own grounds few will be able to solve the problem."

A Western writer calls attention to the fact that the White Sox pitching staff is entirely a five-letter affair—Walsh, Smith, White, Scott, Burns, Sutor and Flete. It's better to have pitchers who are good for only five letters than for only five innings.

The only real and true explanation why Fielder Jones quit the White Sox—so they say now—is that he had an option on a big stretch of Oregon timber, and simply had to watch his little venture. He has made \$75,000 so far, 'tis said, and more is in sight.

Manager McAleer, of the Browns, has signed shortstop Otto Dickle, of the Gunther semi-professional team of Chicago. The time of his joining the team has not been definitely settled. Dickle is one of the star shortstops who has held out of major league base ball for some time.

Simon Pautxis, the University of Pennsylvania graduate whom the Highlanders loaned to the Altoona Club, is rated as one of the best backstops in the Tri-State, and is also accounted one of its star hitsmiths. He will rejoin the Highlanders when the Tri-State season ends, on September 15.

The Mound City fans have grown ugly and show their disappointment at the Browns' low position in the race by unmercifully roasting the players. The result is that McAleer's men have had to have a lot of nerve to stand up under the grueling attacks of the fans, and some of them, in fact, have been unable to do this.

Infielder Jimmy Savage, of the Hartford Club, has been ordered to report to the Highlanders. He has played with Hartford since he was graduated last month from Villanova College, which team he captained. Waterbury, of the Connecticut League, claims to have a contract signed by Savage, so that the National Commission may be called upon to decide the matter.

Reports from Chicago state that work on the White Sox's new base ball field will begin on August 30. The contractors expect to have the field in readiness for opening day next April. The Sox's new home will accommodate 32,000 spectators. The grand stand will have a seating capacity of 14,000, and there will be 4,000 box seats. The lot upon which the diamond and stands are to be built is 600 feet square.
